


ENGLISH CORE LIST 2021 TERM ONE


WHAT ZOLA DID ON MONDAY

From the bestselling author of *Looking for Alibrandi*.




HERE COMES LOLO

Two very different Grade 6 girls meet in their school sick bay.



THE COCONUT CHILDREN

Growing up can feel like a death sentence. Life in a troubled neighbourhood demands too much too young. But Sonny wouldn't really know. Watching the world from her bedroom window, she exists only in second-hand romance novels and falls for any fast-food employee who happens to spare her a glance. Everything changes with the return of Vince, a boy who became a legend after he was hauled away in handcuffs at fourteen. Sonny and Vince used to be childhood friends. But with all that happened in-between, childhood

seems so long ago. It will take two years of juvie, an inebriated grandmother and a porn stash for them to meet again. The Coconut Children is an urgent, moving and wise debut from a young and gifted storyteller.

DID YOU KNOW?

Vivian developed the novel out of the Sydney Story Factory's "Novella Project", making her a successful example of young student writers committed to their craft. She is also a guest speaker at the English Teachers' Association (ETA) conference this year as a former English Extension 2 student to discuss her practice. Teachers can use The Coconut Children for Stage 6: Extension 2 (Major Works), Extension 1 (Literary Worlds) and/or Craft of Writing.




THE ODDS




HOW TO CATCH A STAR




WELCOME TO COUNTRY


A MAP INTO THE WORLD




STORMY - A STORY ABOUT FINDING A FOREVER HOME

Guojing poignantly explores how trust doesn't always come easily, but how, over time, and with kindness and determination, forever love can grow.




THE BOY, THE BEAR, THE BARON, THE BARD AND OTHER DRAMATIC TALES


MIGRANTS




TIGER, TIGER, BURNING BRIGHT!
